LEARN HOW TO:

Robert Hugh Farley MS presents an intensive training course that will focus on non-accidental injuries inflicted on children. The course will emphasize the specific techniques that may be used by the investigator in the assessment, investigation and reconstruction of cases involving soft tissue injuries such as bruises, lacerations and burns. In addition, the various weapons utilized by the offender in child abuse situations will also be identified and discussed. The course will also address the circumstances and evaluation of deprived and neglected children. Lastly, the curriculum offers case illustrations that encourage hands on participation by the student.

LEARN HOW TO:

Robert Hugh Farley MS presents an innovative, training course that addresses the investigation of child sexual abuse and also looks at the “compliant” technology facilitated victim. The course explores the strategic planning that is required in conducting a step-by-step and comprehensive investigation of the circumstances in suspected child sexual abuse cases along with accountability issues pertaining to the caretaker and other family members. The course also examines the identification of potential corroborating witnesses, the joint collection of essential facts and the recognition and recovery of different types of specific corroborating evidence all of which often narrow the focus of the investigation to a specific suspect, while at the same, time anticipating a possible defense. Lastly, the course identifies the roles and responsibilities of all of the members of the Multi-Disciplinary Team (MDT) while stressing the importance of information sharing during an investigation.

Additional topics addressed at the course:

- Understanding the dynamics of child sexual abuse vs. sexual exploitation
- The roles of the core Multi-Disciplinary Team
- Conducting joint investigations – child protective services and law enforcement
- Child sexual abuse indicators
- Child abuse seduction sexual activity
- The role of technology in the sexual abuse of children and young people
- Child molester profiles and the various seduction and molestation techniques
- Locating and identifying child molester collections - Child Erotica / Child Pornography / Trophies
- Addressing the special needs of the “compliant” technology facilitated victim
- Networking with the prosecutor, medical and the mental health MDT members
- Victim disclosure and talking about the abuse
- Assessing the child sexual abuse victim allegation and corroboration
- Information to be obtained during a victim interview and the corroboration of specific details
- Utilizing the freehand drawing interview process for clarification during a child abuse interview
